# Activity 2: Develop your media and information literacy skills with five key questions

# Objectives:

- Develop media literacy skills
- Develop critical thinking using a simple exercise
- Become aware of disinformation

### Materials needed:

- Newspaper article/social media article
- Post-its
- Paperboard
- Internet

### Duration:

20 minutes

# Description:

The Center for Media Literacy (medialit.org) has developed five key questions as a starting point for the analysis of any media message or piece.

Choose an article from a newspaper/social media page about a recent event/topical news.

Divide the class into groups of five or present the article to the plenary session and ask the participants to answer the following questions.

- Who created this message? (Authorship)
- What creative techniques are used to attract my attention? (Format)
- How might different people understand this message differently from me? (Audience)
- What lifestyle, values, and point of view are represented in, or omitted from, this message?
   (Content)
- Why is this message being sent? (Purpose)

Discuss with the whole group the importance of these five questions.









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
